Life Application Questions

“The Life that’s Found in the Lamb of God”

John 6: 51-59

1. In verse 52, the crowd is divided, confused, and offended by Jesus’ words. Instead of seeking to soften or clarify the message, however, Jesus actually proceeds to make it more difficult. Why would He that?
2. In American cultural Christianity, Jesus is often portrayed in a way that contradicts the Jesus revealed in Scripture. How is that clearly demonstrated in today’s passage?
3. How does Jesus’ language in verses 53-57 point His hearers to the type of Messiah He’s come to be, which greatly differs from the Messiah they were seeking?
4. In John 1:29, John the Baptist declared that Jesus is “the Lamb of God, who takes away the sins of the world”. Read Exodus 12:1-27. What details do we find there that parallel Jesus’ words in our passage and foreshadow His sacrificial death as the Lamb of God?
5. What does it mean to eat the flesh and drink the blood of Jesus?
6. What is the significance of abiding in Jesus and having Jesus abide in us?
7. How does this concept of “abiding” enhance our understanding of Jesus’ promise from verse 37?
