John 10:31-42

2. How does the context of Psalm 82, which Jesus quotes in our passage, shed light on the entirety of John 10?
3. What invitation is offered in v. 37-38?
4. How does the context of our passage make Jesus’ invitation even more amazing and gracious? What does this teach us about Jesus and our own rebellion?
5. What is the dramatic difference between the response of the Jewish leaders and those from v. 41-42?
